RMAA could not do it without the collective YOU...our supporters, donors, staff, veterinarians and dedicated board of directors. RMAA has completed more than 37,000 low cost spay neuter surgeries helping to reduce the population of homeless or unwanted cats and dogs while reducing the strain placed on animal shelters.

This has been a busy and successful year for RMAA. We welcomed Dr. Sara Braswell to our great team of Veterinarians in October. Dr Sara does one cat and one dog clinic weekly. She joins Dr. Andy and Dr. George to provide the highest quality in surgery at RMAA.

In 2025 we expanded our collaboration in the sale of "Paws for the Claws" Soaps and lotions, now for sale at the RMAA clinic in Conway and also at McSheffrey's Up North in Glen, NH. Additionally PAWS sponsored a free microchip to any cat that scheduled spay or neuter surgery at RMAA in November 2025.

RMAA welcomed Kathy Covell to our Board of Directors this year. Kathy, local to Conway, has a professional background of helping others and she is definitely helping RMAA through her vast knowledge, and 'people person' expertise.

RMAA again participated in both the Conway July 4th parade and the Freedom Old Home Week parade. Tuckermans Brewery hosted RMAA twice this year and we were in attendance at the Bark in the Park event in September. The annual RMAA yard sale was a success thanks to the many donors of items to sell and volunteers who helped set up.

Lastly I am so grateful to every RMAA team member. They contribute daily to our continued success. This includes our dedicated Staff, Cat Cab Drivers, Veterinarians and maintenance crew.

The RMAA board has been working on some exciting new initiatives for 2026. Stay tuned for that news to be shared in early 2026.

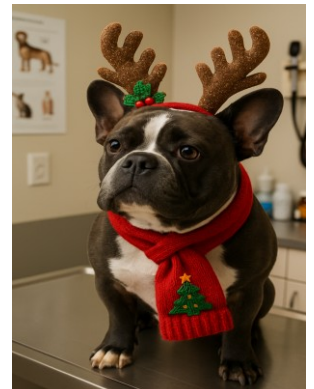

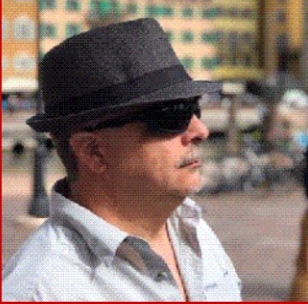

In the spirit of the Holidays, please consider providing a home for a working cat...or two. Barn cats will keep your barn or other building rodent free. Many barn cats are feral and have lived in colonies so they appreciate having a 'buddy.' This gives them someone to cuddle up with when it's cold and offers safety from predators. You will need to provide basic care for them, food, water, shelter and veterinary care. Food should be up high so raccoons and skunks cannot get it but the cats can. Plastic bowls are preferable for food and water. They'll appreciate a heated water bowl in cold weather (pet stores have these). If cats are feral, you will have to trap them for their veterinary appointment.
